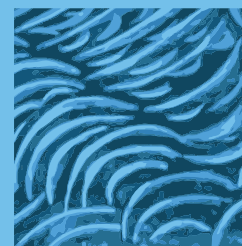
2 – Share your perspective

Living Waters Project — The Future for This Special Place

The Work Shifts

The Living Waters Project now turns from raising money to using that money to renew our ministries. The Vestry will make the final decisions but is relying on two committees to consider the options and logistics and to develop recommendations it will consider:

The Property Committee, led by Patrick Tahara, will do the leg work of listening to the congregation's priorities, fleshing out details of the proposed projects, planning the renewal work, and making architect and project recommendations to the Vestry. Its Charter is available on the Resources Page of the Living Waters website.

The Isaiah Project, led by Lewis Maldonado, is a new working group of All Soulsians charged with discerning how to use the tithe from our Living Waters commitments. Ten percent of the funds raised, apart from the Jordan gift, will be used to repair the breach in our community and our world. Its charter is available on the Resources Page of the Living Waters website.

We Discern — 2022: June-December

The Vestry will lead a Project Input process to help measure the congregation's project priorities. A Project Input exercise will be available on September 18, at the Parish Retreat, and at church within a week or two. Other ways to provide input will be announced shortly. **This is the time to offer input, advice, and feedback on the Living Waters' work.** Everyone is encouraged to participate.

The Property Committee will use this input to draft a provisional scope of work. Toward the end of the year, the Vestry will consider the recommendation of the Property Committee. The Vestry will adopt a provisional scope of work and select an architect.

Starting in mid-fall, the Isaiah Project will develop a list of potential giving areas and a framework for considering potential projects. The committee will announce ways for the congregation to offer ideas about using the tithe to serve our community and deepen our connection with those outside our walls. In December, the Isaiah Project will present specific recommendations to the Vestry for making and administering gifts from the tithe.

We Plan — 2023: January-June

An architect, working with a contractor, will use the scope of work to plan and design the projects. The Property Committee will develop a detailed construction budget. The Vestry will adopt a final construction plan and budget. The Vestry will apply for building permits and plan for how to make church together despite the disruption of the construction process.

After additional congregational input, the Vestry will consider and adopt a plan to use our Living Waters tithe. The Isaiah Project will then add additional team members and begin the planning and implementation of the projects to be funded.

We Build — 2023: June-Beyond

Construction starts! Construction could run between 6 and 12 months (or even longer). Depending on logistics and material supplies, we could finish construction and be back in a renewed church sometime in 2024!

Gifts from the Isaiah Project are intended to have a long-lasting impact on the community. Supporting the organizations that receive a gift from the Isaiah Project will be an ongoing process with opportunities for parishioners to learn and engage along the way.
